What Are Internships?

Internships are a form of experiential education. They allow you to explore a career path and get exposure to a specific industry while gaining valuable skills and experience. Many students develop research projects based on their internship experiences.

Employers use internships to find and train future employees. Some competitive fields can be closed to applicants without this kind of prior experience.

Internships can vary in length from a year, to a semester, to a summer, or even a few weeks.

Start Looking Now

Students that are successful in finding internships start looking early. In a recent survey, 58% of Hopkins students reported that they started looking for summer internships during the fall semester or in early January.

Internships with the Federal Government, internships that require outside funding, and international internships, usually have deadlines during the Fall semester, so start looking now.

1. Access internship listings for JHU students.
Create a Career Center Account and register for On-Campus Recruiting. This will give you access to the internship listings in both the Hopkins Job and Internship Da-

tabase and On-Campus Recruiting & Resume Drops. Check both sections of your Career Center Account regularly for updates

2. Prepare resumes to target a specific internship opportunities in your chosen field.

3. Prepare for the interview.
